00 Gauge Railways - 1:76 Scale



2019 will see the Oxford Rail range of models enlarge further with the addition of a newly tooled locomotive and additional wagon liveries.

The newest model to be added to the Oxford Rail range will be the NER P3 locomotive, which is probably better known as the LNER/ BR Class J27. When the locomotives were initially released into traffic, they were allocated to long distance mineral and freight traffic but superseded by larger locomotive types as the years moved on and demands increased. The design proved to be a robust and a very capable hard-working locomotive class. The J27 could be found all over the North Eastern Region and during the War years could even be spotted as far north as Scotland.

This year will also see the 100th anniversary of the East Kent Light Railway purchasing their Adams Radial locomotive. To commemorate this mile stone in history, Oxford Rail will produce a limited run of commemorative sets. Each commemorative set will include an Adams Radial Locomotive in EKR livery and two new livery 5 plank wagons commonly found in that area. We have also added an additional livery 5 plank wagon to our expanding range of wagons.


The final liveries of the eagerly awaited Mk3a coaches will also go on sale with the ScotRail and Stobart livery Mk3a coaches being available by early 2019.

Our N7 Locomotives will also be released in the first half of 2019 and will be closely followed by the DCC sound versions. Additional liveries have also been added to the ever-popular road rail defender and these should be available later in the year.

Scheduled for release later in 2019 will be our 12T Private owner tank wagons, our modern Airbraked Warwell wagon along with our BL 18-inch Howitzer Rail Gun in all liveries. Oxford Rail will also be adding the BL18 -inch Howitzer Rail Gun in World War 1 camouflage livery to be sold as the rail gun only.

0-6-2T N7 Locomotives

The GER Class K85, later to be reclassified by the LNER as N7 were originally designed by Alfred John Hill of the GER and took to the tracks in 1915. LNER's Nigel Gresley further developed the design of the Class after the 1923 Grouping. Built to service the GN and GE suburban areas of London, the Class which eventually numbered 134 continued to operate on these services until the introduction of DMUs and the electrification of the lines in the 1950s. Some of the locomotives were transferred to areas outside of London but by 1962 the remaining N7s had been completely withdrawn.



4-4-2T Adams Radial Locomotives



By 1923 only thirty Adams Radials of the original seventy one had survived, however by Nationalisation there were only three left in service.

In 1923 the East Kent Railway obtained locomotive 0488 and was reliveried in the company's colours and given the number 5. The locomotive proved to be unsuitable for the railway's needs and was eventually sold to the Southern Railway and numbered 3488. Once obtained by BR the locomotive's number was changed to 30583, which it kept until withdrawal.

To celebrate the 25th anniversary of Oxford Diecast and to commemorate this milestone in the 'Oxford' history, Oxford Rail have released a special anniversary Adams Radial in Late Southern Railways livery.

Presented in a specially commissioned wooden case this model, which includes a numbered certificate is limited to just 250 pieces.

The 0-6-0 GWR 2301 Class was designed by William Dean with all being built at the Great Western Swindon railway works between 1883 – 1899. In all 260 were constructed and although they were originally intended as freight locomotives they were later to be used for passenger services most notably in Wales. Several of the Class were shipped to France and other countries during both World Wars with many returning to the UK after the hostilities had ceased. By 1955 only two of the Class remained with No. 2516 being selected as part of the National Collection.



0-6-0 Class J27 Locomotives

Designed by Wilson Worsdell, the NER P3 class would later be reclassified under the LNER to J27. The J27 was a modification of the earlier NER P2 (LNER J26), the biggest changes were in the depth of the firebox and shallower sloping grate. 115 engines in total were built and over their working careers received many modifications. The class were built to handle long distance freight and mineral trains but were soon displaced once larger engines started to be built. The design proved to be robust and a very capable workhorse, pulling heavy coal trains, with the last J27 being withdrawn in September 1967. Only one example survives of a once strong class of 115 locomotives. Number 65894 was purchased by the North Eastern Locomotive Preservation Group.

IOM Steam Locomotive - Narrow Gauge

Built by Beyer, Peacock & Co at their Gorton Foundry, Manchester in 1905 and was numbered '10'. The locomotive was named after the then Isle of Man Railway company secretary, George Henry Woods. This locomotive was one of two medium boilered locomotives introduced during that period. This static model is produced in diecast and is non-working.



Mk3a ScotRail Coaches

The ScotRail franchise operated from September 1983 until March 1997. In that time the company adopted on its Mk3a coaching stock a variation on the more familiar InterCity Executive livery. The red stripe that ran the length of each coach side was replaced with the more traditional Scottish saltire blue stripe with the InterCity branding being replaced with the ScotRail name. Similarly most of the Scottish locomotives had their branding changed from the standard InterCity Executive livery to ScotRail. (Please note: Some of the images shown are pre-production


Mk3a Stobart Pullman Service Coach

Being the result of a rationalisation plan, the Stobart Pullman Service was officially launched in February 2008. The service was mainly concerned with rail tour trains that ran regular trips as well as specific charters mainly to prestigious events such as Royal Ascot. Also used for private hire, the Stobart Pullman Service was able to offer silver service dining. Several Class 47 locomotives operated by DRS provided the motive power with the coach stock mainly consisting of Mk3a First Open coaches.
